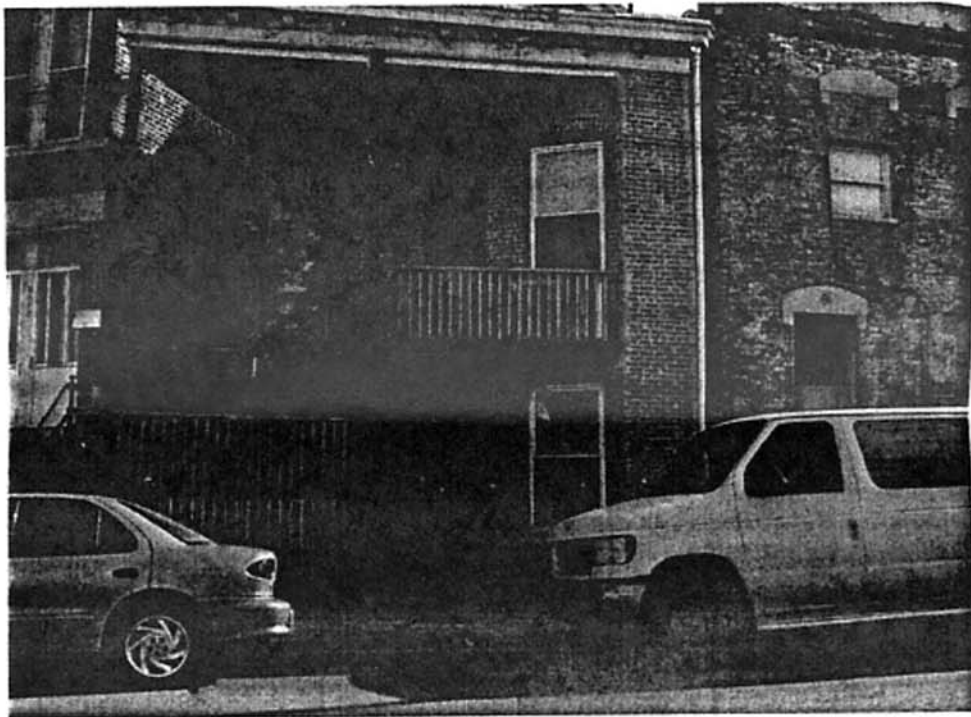

Attachment A

The premises is a two story, red brick apartment building located at 1908 South Canalport Avenue, Chicago 60608. The apartment building has two units. Unit #1 can be accessed from the street level while unit #2 can be accessed using a wooden staircase that faces South Canalport Avenue. At the top of the staircase is a red door with no identifying markings. A black mailbox at the base of the staircase bears the words "APT#2."



Attachment B

1. Access devices, including any and all credit and debit cards, codes, account numbers, electronic serial numbers, personal identification numbers, and databases containing access devices.
2. Computer hardware and computer equipment, including any electronic device capable of data processing (such as central processing units, laptop or notebook computers, personal digital assistants, and wireless communication devices); internal and peripheral storage devices (such as fixed disks, external hard disks, floppy disk drives and diskettes, tape drives and tapes, optical and compact disk storage devices, and other memory storage devices); peripheral input/output devices (such as keyboards, printers, scanners, plotters, video display monitors, and optical readers); related communication devices (such as modems, cables and connections, recording equipment, RAM and ROM units, acoustic couplers, automatic dialers, speed dialers, programmable telephone dialing or signaling devices, and electronic tone generating devices); and any devices, mechanisms, or parts that can be used to restrict access to such hardware (such as physical keys and locks).
3. Computer software, meaning any and all information, instructions, programs, or program codes, stored in the form of electronic, magnetic, optical, or other media, which is capable of being interpreted by a computer or its related components. Computer software may also include data, data fragments, or control characters integral to the operation of computer software, such as operating systems software, applications software, utility programs, compilers, interpreters, communications software, and other programming used or intended to be used to communicate with computer components.
4. Computer-related documentation, meaning any written, recorded, printed, or electronically-stored material which explains or illustrates the configuration or use of any seized computer hardware, software, or related items.
5. Computer passwords and data security devices, meaning any devices, programs, or data -- whether themselves in the nature of hardware or software -- that can be used or are designed to be used to restrict access to, or to facilitate concealment of, any computer hardware, computer software, computer-related documentation, or electronic data records. Such items include, but are not limited to, data security hardware (such as encryption devices, chips and circuit boards); passwords; data security software or information (such as test keys and encryption codes); similar information that is required to access computer programs or data or to otherwise render programs or data into usable form.

6. Any computer or electronic records, documents and materials, including those used to facilitate interstate communications, in whatever form and by whatever means such records, documents, or materials, their drafts or their modifications, may have been created or stored, including, but not limited to, any hand-made form (such as writing or marking with any implement on any surface, directly or indirectly, relating to the described offense); any photographic form (such as microfilm, microfiche, prints, slides, negative, video tapes, motion pictures or photocopies); any mechanical form (such as photographic records, printing or typing); any electrical, electronic, or magnetic form (such as tape recordings, cassettes, compact disks); or any information on an electronic or magnetic storage device (such as floppy diskettes, hard disks, CD-ROMs, optical disks, printer buffers, sort cards, memory calculators, electronic dialers, or electronic notebooks, as well as printouts or readouts from any magnetic storage device.

7. Any electronic information or data, stored in any form, which has been used or prepared for use either for periodic or random backup (whether deliberate, inadvertent, automatically or manually initiated), or any computer or computer system. The form such information might take includes, but is not limited to, floppy diskettes, fixed hard disks, removable hard disk cartridges, tapes, laser disks, CD-ROM disks, video cassettes, and other media capable of storing magnetic or optical coding.

8. Any electronic storage device capable of collection, storing, maintaining, retrieving, concealing, transmitting, and using electronic data, in the form of electronic records, documents, and materials, including those used to facilitate interstate communications. Included within this paragraph is any information stored in the form of electronic, magnetic, optical, or other coding on computer media or on media capable of being read by a computer or computer-related equipment, such as fixed disks, external hard disks, removable hard disk cartridges, floppy disk drives and diskettes, tape drives and tapes, optical storage devices, laser disks, or other memor storage devices.

9. Records of personal and business activities relating to the operation of a computer, such as notes (however and whenever written, stored or maintained), books, diaries, and reference materials relating to the described offense.

10. Documents, information, computer log files, or communications between individuals relating to computer hacking and "carder" activity, including but not limited to, transfer logs, chat logs and e-mails.

11. Any records or documents in whatever form, pertaining to: (a) accounts held with Internet Service Providers or relating to Internet use; (b) user names and passwords to passwords to hacking and carder sites and secure communication services; and (c) carder or hacking activity, carder or hacking sites, or individuals who participate in carder or hacking activity.
